The global ransomware threat is expected to increase over the next two years due to Artificial Intelligence (AI), warns the National Cyber Security Centre (NCSC).

AI is already being used in malicious cyber activity and will almost certainly increase the volume and impact of cyber attacks, according to the new term of AI on the cyber threat assessment, published by NCSC.

The NCSC report highlights that by reducing the entry barriers for inexperienced cybercriminals, hackers-for-hire, and hacktivists, AI empowers less skilled threat actors to conduct more efficient access and information-gathering operations.

This heightened accessibility, coupled with AI's ability to enhance victim targeting, is anticipated to escalate the global ransomware threat over the next two years.

While it is essential to focus on the risks posed by AI, we must not be downhearted as it presents cyber defenders, like ourselves, powerful tools for our armoury. For example, AI can improve the detection and triage of cyber attacks and identify malicious emails and phishing campaigns, ultimately making them easier to counteract.

Outlook - Find Time

If you are finding it difficult to schedule a meeting at a mutually convenient time, use Outlooks New Scheduling Poll:

- Compose your email, incl. recipients
- Click on New Scheduling Poll (top ribbon)
- Customise options as appropriate
- Outlook will offer a selection of times based on your availability (and possibly that of colleagues with your organisation)
- Click Next, Create / Insert Poll
- Send email
- Recipients can then select their preferences and Outlook will calculate the best time
- Click on Poll for results
