Studies show that around 82% of data breaches such as phishing, stolen credentials, misuse, or simply poor security practices (like using weak passwords or failing to update software) involve a human element.

Most successful infiltrations start with a phishing email that targets employees, tricking them into clicking on a malicious link, downloading malware, or entering their credentials on a fake site. Attackers exploit human psychology to bypass technical defences, making phishing one of the most common attack methods.

Tips & Tricks

SmartArt

This is a useful tool that allows you to create visually engaging diagrams, like organisational charts, processes, and timelines, without the need for complex design skills Here's how:

- In your PPP insert a text box and type in a list of the info you wish to present
- In the Home tab (top ribbon), select Convert to SmartArt, select a design
- Change colours (top ribbon)

If you wish to adapt the design:

- Ctrl + Shift + G will ungroup the shapes so that you can manipulate them to suit (you may have to repeat if there is more than one group).
