Outlook Rules

Outlook rules are automated actions that are applied to incoming or outgoing emails, based on conditions set by the user. These rules help to organise, categorise, respond to, or move emails without manual intervention.

Common Uses for Rules

- Automatically move emails from specific senders to designated folders
- Flag important emails or set up notifications for emails from VIP contacts
- Automatically delete or archive emails based on criteria to keep your inbox clean
- Forward specific types of emails to another account
- Automatically reply with predefined responses to certain emails

How

- Select Home tab at top of screen
- Select Rules in top ribbon
- Complete as required
